Council News:

Just like that summer has come to an end; Mayor and Council wish students of all ages a safe, healthy, and enjoyable school year. Some residents may be aware, we have recently added the municipal logo to our Public Works trucks and our municipal office vehicle. As we continue to try and modernize our services, we are also looking to improve our municipal image and professionalism in the process.

A big thank you goes out to the Vermilion Bay Lions Club for organizing and running the Family Fun Day August 19th and the Machin Volunteer Fire Department and all other volunteers who contributed to the success of the day. It was great to have a community event attended by so many people; next year will be exciting!

On Tuesday August 23rd MP Eric Melillo visited the Machin office to talk with Mayor Griffiths about ongoing issues. Some topics discussed revolved around our asset management plan and current FedNor funding applications. We'd like to thank Eric for taking the time to travel to our office to stay up to date with our Municipality and needs.

Economic Development:

Our Phase 2 FedNor application for a Community Improvement Plan and Economic Strategic Plan has been sent in. At the end of July FedNor let us know we have been granted permission to move on to the second phase of our application. Following years 1 & 2 of the suggested actions in our Economic Strategic Plan we seem to be making progress; an update will help to let us know where we're currently at and what our next steps should be. A Community Improvement Plan will help target fixing community image issues through municipal grants as well as make tax incentives to increase development in our business area.

Council recently approved a By-Law allowing the creation of an Economic Development Committee. We're looking for individuals to help contribute to carrying out targets in our Economic Strategic Plan as well as help further the business community. Topics included are going to be aimed around current projects and topics brought forward by businesses in this area. A letter is being sent out asking for advice from businesses and input for progressing the community.

Carbon Monoxide and Heating Safety

Carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible, odourless and poisonous gas produced by fuel-burning appliances and equipment. When a fuel-burning appliance does not get enough fresh air and fails to completely burn its fuel, carbon monoxide is produced.

The symptoms of CO poisoning are similar to the flu – nausea, headache, burning eyes, confusion and drowsiness – except there is no fever. If symptoms appear, immediately get everyone outside to fresh air and call 911.

To keep your home safe from carbon monoxide, eliminate CO at the source. Have your home's fuel-burning appliances and equipment inspected annually by a certified technician. The inspection should include all fuel-burning appliances/equipment and their systems, such as the fuel supply, chimney/venting system and area around the device. To find a TSSA-registered contractor, visit COSafety.ca

In addition to an annual inspection, occasionally examine your heating system for signs of deterioration, such as water stains, corrosion or leakage.

For forced-air systems, clean the furnace air filters frequently – at least twice a year.

Keep the area around the furnace free from dust, lint and materials or chemicals that could catch fire or explode if they become too hot.

Houses need to "breathe". They need to expel moisture and other gases from inside and take in fresh air from outside. If the home's ventilation is damaged or blocked, there is a powerful exhaust fan or there is an open-hearth fireplace, then carbon monoxide can be drawn back inside the house. To prevent CO being drawn back into the house, make sure warm-air outlets and cold-air outlets are not covered by furniture or debris and check that the chimney and all vents to outside are free of debris and that they are kept clear of snow and ice buildup throughout the winter.

If home has a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage, a working CO alarm must be correctly installed on every level of your home and near sleeping areas.

Working smoke alarms must be correctly installed on every story of home and outside all sleeping areas.

Test your CO and smoke alarms once a month to verify that that are working properly.






