Municipal Notes

COUNCIL NEWS

The summer seems to be passing quickly as we are already heading into August; with that being said there are still a lot of fun summer activities planned in August and we hope to see lots of people attend them. As some residents may be aware, our digital speed signs have been put up in different locations of the Municipality. These speed signs will allow us to track the speeds of vehicles that pass that location and also use the numbers as an example of the amount of traffic that enters our community. The information collected is also going to be shared with policing officials at our monthly police board meetings; here we can show evidence of our concerns with speeding in the area.

Mayor and Council are pleased to say the deal with CP rail for the property on Spruce Ave. directly off Highway 17 is now officially closed and the Municipality owns it. In the past a large reason behind stalled development or missed opportunities was lack of developable land. With our recent property purchases we feel we are taking a step ahead; there is a lot of red tape that restricts our ability to move forward but it's unfortunately something we have to deal with and keep fighting.

Ely lake is a project we have been working on for the last 15 years and serves as a prime example of how red tape affects small municipalities like ourselves. With that being said, we have submitted an application to MNRF based on our "Pilot Project" requirements. We now wait for comment from the Ministry and hope that our next steps are a public consultation to move this project forward. If you're curious about the report/application, please reach out to a staff member and they can provide you with the document.

Economic Development:

I will start off with bad news; we were declined in the round 2 of applications to the Ontario Trillium Foundation through the Resilient Communities Fund. The Municipality applied for funding to have weekly art and yoga classes through a two-year span. However, our previous approval through OTF to hire a Recreation Facilitator also included money for art and yoga classes but not as frequently as every week.

We have just applied again to the Ontario Trillium Foundation through the Capital Grant Fund for playground and fitness equipment at the Pine Tree Park. The proposed location of the equipment is on the vacant grass area across from the pavilion and by the Water Treatment Plant. We were declined previously for this project due to the competitive number of applications submitted. I'd like to note that when applying for grants we don't focus directly on certain areas; our goal is to try and utilize the grant in the best possible way we can for the overall benefit of the Municipality.

The Municipality of Machin will no longer be accepting propane tanks and cylinders at the Eagle River and Vermilion Bay landfills. Trespassing continues to be an issue and the theft of the brass fittings on propane tanks has forced us to make this decision. Without their brass fittings, propane tanks cost \$6 each to be picked up plus the charge of delivery. Residents will have to seek other options in the area if they wish to dispose of their propane tanks or cylinders.

Home Fire Prevention

Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarms

Install working smoke alarms on every story of the home and outside all sleeping areas. Install carbon monoxide alarms outside all sleeping areas, if home has a fuel burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage. It's the law.

Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms once a month and change the alarm's batteries annually or whenever the low-battery warning sounds.

Always follow the manufacturer's instructions for installing, testing, maintaining and replacing your alarms.

Home Fire Escape Planning

- Develop a home fire escape plan and practice it with the entire household.
- Make sure everyone knows two ways out of each room, if possible.
- Determine who will be responsible for helping anyone that may need assistance when escaping.
- Choose a meeting place outside, where everyone can be accounted for.
- Call 911 from outside the home.
- Once out, stay out. Never re-enter a burning building.
- Keep all exits in the home clear and easy to use.
- Cooking Fire Prevention Cooking is the #1 cause of home fires.
- Always stay in the kitchen while cooking. If you must leave, turn off the stove. Cooking left unattended is the cause of 52% of all cooking fires.
- Keep anything that burns cooking utensils, dishcloths, paper towels, potholders, food packaging, etc., a safe distance from the stove.
- Loose-fitting clothes can come into contact with stove burners and catch fire. Wear tight sleeves or roll them up when cooking.

Electrical Fire Prevention

- Check cords for damage such as fraying or nicks. A damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.
- Avoid running cords under rugs, which can damage the cord and cause a fire.
- Avoid overloading electrical outlets.
- Extension cords should be used only as a temporary connection. If permanent wiring is required, have additional outlets installed by a licensed electrician. Extension cords should not be linked together.
- Air conditioners and other heavy appliances should be plugged directly into an outlet.

Additional Fire Prevention

- Keep matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children.
- Always blow out candles before leaving the room.
- If anyone in home smokes, smoke outside. Use large deep ashtrays and empty ashes into a metal container not the garbage can.

Section 33(1) of the *Municipal Elections Act* provides that a person may be nominated for an office by filing a nomination with the Returning Officer in the Municipal Office in person or by an agent. The nomination form shall be in the prescribed Form 1 (Nomination Paper) available from the Clerk-Treasurer the nomination fee is to be paid in cash or certified cheque or money order; the fee is \$100.00 for Councilors and \$200.00 for Mayor. Facsimile signatures are not acceptable.

The nomination form may be filed at anytime during normal office hours (8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) beginning May 2, 2022 up to and including Nomination Day, August 19, 2022, with a 2 p.m. deadline, for the following offices:




Lucky Seniors are looking for more seniors to join our club.


